Defensive Driving Class Aug. 16

JUNE BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The Fulton County Farm Bureau Board of Directors met in regular session on Thursday, June 13, 2024, at the Farm Bureau office in Lewistown starting at 7:00 p.m. pursuant to due notice given. The meeting was called to order and presided over by President Barry Fisher. Other board members present were Robin Fisher, Delson Wilcoxen, Nick Cleer, Seth Vohland, and Leah Brown. David Tolley and Levi Porter attended via Zoom. Also present was Manager Elaine.

In correspondences, thank you letters were received from our St. Germaine students for the Field Trip. There were no affiliate reports.

The minutes from the April meeting were emailed and mailed out before the meeting for the board members to read. These were placed on file with no changes.

Treasurer Linda Rock discussed the financial statements for April and May. She noted that a CD had come due at MidAmerica National Bank and was renewed at a rate of 5.8%. One will come due in a couple of weeks at Tompkins State Bank. Elaine will

check on rates for that one. The financial reports for April and May were placed on file.

Elaine gave the Membership Report: In total, we have 969 regular members at the end of previous month, 11 professional members, and 1549 associate members for a total of 2529 members. She reminded Directors to reach out to members who did not renew their dues this year.

Committee Reports were given:

Young Leaders – The Farmer's Tan contest will be held at the county fair again. On June 26th they will be shopping for a donation to the Fulton County Humane Society.

Ag in the Classroom- We made plastic bag ice cream in several classrooms and learned about farmer's markets during the last months of school. The AITC freezer meal fundraiser raised about \$3,000.

Local Issues – no report

Legislative – Carbon capture pipeline topic has resurfaced. The current push is that if 75% of the landowners say yes to the pipeline footprint, the pipeline will go through and the other 25% will get zero compensation.

Marketing – no report

Business Service – We had the kitchen sink garbage disposal replaced. Copier rental expired and Xerox did not respond to requests for renewal. Arrangements have been made with a different company at a lower rate

Promotion and Education – Leah provided a report. (Detailed elsewhere in this issue).



AITC REPORT

During April, my topic in area grade schools was Soil and the Wonderful World of Worms! I was in 43 classrooms that month and reached 779 students. During the month, I also spoke to the Retired Teachers group about our program. The Freezer Meal fundraiser we conducted on April 26th raised \$3300 profit! A HUGE thank you to all who helped prepare and assemble the meals, and especially to those who patronized our sale.

In the waning days of the school year throughout May, I presented to 50 classes, reaching a total of 953 kids! The main topic was Farmer's Markets. The Canton Chamber of Com-

merce collaborated with us to collect coupons for \$1 additional on produce with a \$5 purchase at Canton Farmers Market June 1 thru Aug 15th. AITC is providing funds to reimburse the Chamber for monies



advanced to sellers. Students learned about specialty crops, what part of plant food comes from, the purpose of Farmers Market, and about pricing. They "made" their own Farmers Market and were given a chance to sample foods offered at Farmers Markets that perhaps they had not tried before like turnips, asparagus, broccoli, peppers, as well as ones like blueberries, strawberries, grapes, apples, carrots, green beans, and lettuce.

I attended the Ag in the Classroom Coordinator meeting on May 21st at Richland Center in Bloomington. We have planned for and sent notices to Fulton County teachers for our Summer Ag Institute being held July 16 thru 18th, 2024. I'm signed up for 3 Continuing Education seminars in June, and will be working on our FCAE Grant report and application for the next program year.

I will be presenting at the Canton YMCA Summer Program again this year. Every other Tuesday I will provide Agriculture learning to their day. Our first program was earlier this month on their theme "Community Day's." I used our large game wheel and a bingo card to discuss agricultural jobs in our community. I gave leftover rock candy (from our soil presentations!) for prizes. I will give 2 presentations each month this summer, reaching about 70 kids each time.

So even though "school's out for the Summer," we can't have a day without AGRI-CULTURE!


